It's a great way to spend a winter morning or afternoon and a very special opportunity for your child to have you be a part of their preschool program!

Keep Your Class Calendar(s) Handy

We make every effort to email class calendars on the last school day before each new theme begins. Activities and projects are likely different each day, but not always, so be sure to look at each of your child's calendars every day to check current activities and participation items (show & tell, dress-up days, etc.) Calendars include weekly language, math, science activities and concepts to be covered, arts & crafts and special events - be sure to read yours and keep it handy. We ask our present preschool parents to please help spread the word to friends and neighbors about our upcoming Open House for new prospective parents. It will be held on Monday evening, January 13th from 7 – 8 PM. The Open House gives parents who are not familiar with VGP a chance to meet the staff, hear about the program and see the classroom space for themselves. We recommend that parents leave children at home, but we know that this is not always possible.

Music & Movement Enrichment Program

We're excited that our popular Music & Movement enrichment program will begin soon for our morning classes! Mrs. Stevens (TuTh Co-Teacher) developed the program which incorporates her dance instruction experience and introduces various music styles and real musical instruments! Mrs. Stevens has been teaching dance to 2–8-year-olds at MEM Dance Studio for the past twelve years. This program will run for eight weeks and begins on Thursday, January 16 and Friday, January 17. Each Thursday or Friday morning your child will dance and play to the beat and learn more about music & movement as they go! Parents are welcome to participate – please check with your lead teacher to confirm your child's group.

radKIDS Enrichment Program

Afternoon students will enjoy ten radKIDS enrichment sessions, which teaches personal safety and self-empowerment - children learn techniques to be safe in and outside their home. Our program has been tailored for the preschool-aged child by the instructors, Mike and Sue Sonia. Permission forms will be given to our afternoon students and parents can opt out. The program will be on Thursday and Friday afternoons (except the first two weeks) and each class will have one half-hour session a week for ten weeks starting on Tuesday, January 14 and Friday, January 17. Parents are encouraged to participate (optional) – please check with your lead teacher to confirm your child's group time (you do not need to volunteer in the class or sign up ahead.)

We have had the pleasure to host Sue and Mike Sonia for radKIDS personal safety and self-empowerment sessions for our afternoon preschoolers for many years. Mike & Sue have been leading the radKIDS program at the Sterling Gym for over 18 years. They started teaching the preschool version at VGP over 13 years ago and it has been a wonderful enrichment program for the children! You can check out the website for Sterling Martial Arts and the radKIDS website has some excellent resources and information to check out as well.

Todorov Toy Drive

radKIDS Attire & Simulation

Please have your afternoon child wear comfortable clothing (pants, sweats, etc.) and sturdy footwear on radKIDS days.

On April 10 and 11, the children will demonstrate what they have learned at the end of the ten-week period with a parent audience simulation. A sign-up sheet will be posted, and reminders provided. An added bonus to participating in radKIDS now, is that any child who completes this program will be able to take a future radKIDS class at any time free of charge!

What Does "Nut Free" Mean?

When we say that VGP is a 'nut-free' school, it means that ALL food brought to school needs to be free of all nuts, including nut butters (peanut, almond, hazelnut, etc.) Please check labels on all store-bought snacks to see if they contain nut meal, nuts, or nut flour, or "may contain nuts" or "are made on the same equipment as products that contain nuts." If you see any of these warnings on a snack, please do not bring it to school. It can be a struggle for families to keep an allergic child safe, but a little sensitivity on the part of others can go a long way to making an allergic/food sensitive child feel included.

We focus on nut allergies because a nut or peanut allergy can cause difficulty breathing and other very serious health problems, including anaphylaxis, which is a sudden, life-threatening allergic reaction. **The nut-free policy at VGP also includes Lunch Bunch.** At Lunch Bunch, even though a child may not eat nuts themselves, it can be hazardous to a nut-allergic child when nut residue is transferred to surfaces. It is our intention that this policy will eliminate any potential for allergic reactions due to nut products in our school environment. Thank you for your sensitivity to this matter.

Holiday Gift to Teachers
